NEW ROSES 2012

AMELIA

Shrub Rose. 1823. 3ft.

A lovely old Alba shrub rose bred by Jean-Pierre Vibert in France.

Quite small for an Alba but has plenty of large semi double cupped blooms of pure pink in clusters with pronounced golden anthers.

Grey green foliage

A very attractive rose with a superb fragrance.

Only summer flowering but a nice addition to any rose lovers garden.

Also known in France as "Amélie"

Best in full sun but will cope with some shade.



ANNABELLE

Floribunda Rose. 1972. 3ft

A real eye-catching floribunda with masses of blooms from May to October.

The blooms are quite a stunning mixture of orange/red blends and make a real statement in the garden.

Has been around for a while but the blooms do well on the show bench and have made it popular for many years.

Fragrant.

Bred by Kordes in Germany.

Also known as Annabell.



BETTYS SMILE

Hybrid Tea Rose. 2011. 3ft-4ft

What a lovely rose this is, and a lovely name to match.

A tall elegant rose with stunning blooms of blush pink with shades of apricot towards the centre.

Quite an unknown rose at the moment, but looks the type to really catch the eye and the public attention.

It was bred by a Robert Webster and introduced by RV Rogers who will no doubt know the history behind the rose and the name.

Like most HT it will flower right through the summer and make quite a statement in the garden.

We will update its history as soon as we can.

BRIDE AND GROOM (Smi10-98)

Hybrid Tea Rose. 3ft

Lovely dark pink buds open up into large high centred Hybrid Tea style blooms of baby pink which are produced singularly and in small clusters of 2 to 5 blooms per stem on strong sturdy upright growth.

Young foliage is a highly attractive red and bronze semi gloss which darkens to a pleasing Olive green with age.

'Bride and Groom' is the perfect wedding gift and ideal wedding colour which fits well into the modern garden and would also make a great container plant, repeat flowers through summer and has shown exceptional disease resistance.

NEW ROSES 2012

CENTENARY (Korledas)

Floribunda Rose. 1996. 3ft

This lovely award winning floribunda has masses of deep pink blooms right through the season.

The semi-double blooms are produced in small clusters right through the summer on a healthy upright bush.

The glossy dark green foliage really shows off the blooms to perfection.

Bred by Kordes in Germany in 1966 and introduced to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Notcutts roses in Suffolk.

Makes a lovely gift for that very important birthday of anniversary.

Wild rose fragrance.

CITY OF YORK

Rambling Rose. 1945. 15ft.

This lovely old Rambler has been around a while, but we have included it in our Rambler section as we have had so many requests for it as it is considered to be one of the best of the repeat ramblers.

Most ramblers are only summer flowering, but this is one of the few that repeat well.

It produces large clusters of creamy white blooms with attractive yellow centres, plus quite a good perfume for a rambler.

Leathery glossy green foliage which has excellent disease resistance.

A very versatile rose as it can be grown up trees, is shade tolerant, can be grown on any aspect including a North wall and will cope with poor soils.

Won an American Rose Society Gold Medal in 1950

Bred by Tantau. Germany 1939-1945. There are some date differences of opinion regarding this rose.



CLEOPATRA (Korverpea)

Hybrid Tea Rose. 1994. 3ft

A very beautiful Hybrid Tea that is not very well known which is a great shame as it is quite a stunner.

Outstanding blooms of rich scarlet with deep harvest gold reverse. The blooms are mostly single but do occasionally appear in clusters.

Repeats well through the season and makes an excellent garden rose and is ideal for cutting.

Good healthy large glossy foliage.

For the best results dead head the blooms regularly.

Fragrant.

NEW ROSES 2012

EDWARDS ROSE (Smi73-7-97)

Floribunda. 2008. 3ft-4ft

This extremely disease resistant rose produces masses of exquisitely shaped deep salmon blooms, suffused in the centre with golden yellow.

Edward's Rose flowers in repeat waves and large clusters of bloom from early summer to early winter.

The plant has a tidy upright habit growing to approx 0.9m with attractive bronzed young foliage which darkens to a deep gloss green.

EYES FOR YOU

Floribunda. 2008. 2ft-6ins

A lovely but very unusual rose.

A floribunda with large blooms which can be as big as 4ins across. The colour is described as mauvy-lilac but the main eye catcher is the large purple blotch in the centre.

The huge blooms repeat all summer and really stand out in the crowd.

The foliage is very healthy with good disease resistance.

Not very tall so will grow in a container or the garden.

A bed of these eye catchers will stop the traffic.

Lovely perfume.

FIGHTING TEMERAIRE (Autrava)

English Shrub/Climber. David Austin. 2011. 5ft plus

'Fighting Temeraire' is a rose of very different character to most English roses making a beautiful and very useful addition to the collection.

The fully open flowers are very large, 4-5ins across, have only ten petals, and are produced with exceptional freedom. They are a rich apricot colour, with an area of yellow behind the stamens. By the time the petals are ready to drop, the colour has faded to a soft yellow-apricot. The tips of the pointed buds are red, as are the young leaves and foliage, further enhancing the effect.

'Fighting Temeraire' is particularly healthy and vigorous and will develop into a most attractive rounded shrub, the many stems producing a mass of flowers held in large heads.

The fragrance is medium to strong, very fruity with a strong element of lemon zest.

This is a very good choice for a mixed border, where the rich colour will create a focal point, or may be trained as a short climber reaching around 8ft.

'Fighting Temeraire' is a painting from 1839 by the famous landscape painter, watercolourist and print maker, JMW Turner.

This rose has been named for the Turner Contemporary Gallery on Margate's sea front in Kent.

FRANCOIS JURANVILLE

Rambling rose. 1906. 15ft-20ft

A beautiful old rambler that seems to have been popular for ever.

The bright salmon pink blooms appear in clusters over quite a long flowering period in the summer.

The blooms are a deeper pink in the centre with a yellow base.

Not for the small garden or the faint hearted as it can easily reach 25ft (8m) when mature.

Upright vigorous growth with shiny dark green leaves which are tinged with bronze green at the edges.

The late Jack Harkness described this rose as one of the most beautiful of the wichuraiana hybrids.

A very versatile rose as it will tolerate shade, poor soil, will grow on a North wall, and is an excellent rose for rambling up trees.

A pleasant fragrance which is reminiscent of apples.

Often confused with 'Albertine'

Bred in France 1906

FREE SPIRIT (Fryjeru)

Floribunda. 2006. 2ft-3ft

An easy to grow and trouble free rose which produces a very colourful display in the garden or container.

Repeats well right through the summer with stunning salmon pink blooms in clusters.

Dark green glossy foliage which looks superbly healthy and has excellent disease resistance.

If you are looking for a good splash of colour in the garden you won't beat this one.

Shrub Rose. 1997. 4ft.

A very beautiful modern shrub rose which looks sure to be a hit with rose lovers,

Blooms in flushes throughout the summer and is a real head turner in the garden.

Healthy matt green foliage and bushy upright growth.

Not a powerful perfume but very pleasing.

JUDE THE OBSCURE (Ausjo)

English Shrub Rose. David Austin. 1989. 3ft-4ft.

'Jude The Obscure' vies with 'Golden Celebration' for the first place as the most magnificent of the English Roses.

Its flowers are very large and of incurved chalice shape.

Their colour is a pleasing medium yellow on the inside of the petals and a paler yellow on the outside.

It has excellent, strong and almost disease free growth.

This rose is particularly fine in a dry climate, although it may ball in the rain.

A very strong, and unusual delicious fragrance with a fruity note reminiscent of guava and sweet white wine.

Quite hardy plus good repeat flowering habit.

Named after the character in Thomas Hardy's novel.



JULIA'S KISS

Hybrid Tea Rose. 2001. 3ft-4ft.

Quite a beautiful rose that is not very well known as very few growers list it .

A very showy rose with large exhibition quality blooms of cream/pink.

The blooms are produced mainly singly with an occasional cluster. However it is quite a show in full bloom and it repeats well right through the season until the first frosts.

Healthy dark green foliage.

Bred by Lionel Poole in the UK.



KATHRYN

Floribunda. 2010. 3ft

An attractive floribunda where the bloom colour is hard to describe.

Red/mauve blooms with a distinctive white reverse which is quite unusual.

Good repeat cycle and the flowers come in small clusters well into late summer.

Healthy semi glossy dark green foliage and is almost thornless.

A real head turner in the garden or container.

For the best results, dead head regularly and feed in spring and summer.

LET THERE BE LOVE (Frysoda)

Floribunda. 2011. 3ft

A lovely name for a beautiful rose.

For the romantics amongst us this is an irresistible beauty-with adorable soft pink blooms that are absolutely exquisite, each one perfectly formed and larger than you would expect for a floribunda.

The blooms are produced in clusters with a good long flowering period from early summer until the first frosts.

Healthy medium green glossy foliage really shows off the blooms to perfection.

LET'S CELEBRATE (Fryraffles)

Floribunda. 2011. 3ft.

A spellbinding new floribunda with fascinating colour blooms of silvery white, shaded and blotched purple mauve in an almost surreal combination.

They are medium sized and double with multi petals prettily arranged creating an attractive ruffled appearance.

The scented flowers are carried in large trusses and borne plentifully on a bushy plant of neat even habit that grows easily and is densely covered with foliage.

Specially named for the north west area of NAFAS (National Association of Flower Arrangement Societies) to celebrate their Golden Anniversary in 2011.

LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE (Dicgungho)

Floribunda. 2010. 3ft.

One of nicest little floribunda's in recent years.

Very colourful blooms of yellow fused with orange in clusters of twenty or more.

Repeats well from early summer until the first frosts.

Small healthy medium green glossy foliage.

A great garden rose or compact enough to grow in a container.

Excellent perfume.

A lovely little rose for a girls birthday or christening.

LOVE FOREVER

Hybrid Tea Rose. 3ft-4ft.

A classic hybrid tea in a fine, traditional colour, whose true beauty is in the exceptional size of its blooms.

The bush is sturdy and upright, with high-quality flower-form, and strong perfume.

It's a splendid rose to grow in borders, and ideal to cut for vase-arrangement.

MAID MARION (Austobias)

English Shrub Rose. David Austin) 2010. 3ft

'Maid Marion' at its best, is considered to be one of the most superbly formed flowers in the English Rose collection.

The buds start as rounded cups with larger outer petals, enclosing numerous smaller petals within.

These open to the most perfect rosette-shaped flowers in the form of a saucer; the outer petals forming a perfectly rounded rim. Their colour is a clear rose pink.

The growth is relatively upright but quite bushy and compact.

Initially the fragrance is a soft myrrh - as the flower ages it becomes more fruity with a distinct clove character.

'Maid Marion' was the companion of the mythical hero 'Robin Hood' of Sherwood Forest.

MOMENT IN TIME (Korcastraw)

Floribunda. 2012. 2ft-3ft

ROSE OF THE YEAR 2012

Good red floribundas are always in demand so this one should prove very popular.

Masses of rich ruby red blooms all through the summer until the first frosts.

It was chosen as Rose Of The Year for its excellent health and prolific freedom of flower.

The healthy dark green glossy foliage is almost hidden under the numerous blooms.

Makes a very colourful garden rose and looks great in a container.

Fragrant.

For the best results plant in full sun, dead head regularly and feed in the spring and again in the summer.

Deserves the title 'Rose Of The Year'

NURSE TRACY DAVIES (Frykookie)

Floribunda. 2006. 2ft.

A floribunda with sparkling bright golden yellow blooms in clusters.

The blooms keep their bright colour until the petals drop.

A neat compact bush which produces masses of blooms continuously throughout the summer.

Not very big so will be quite at home in a container or the garden.

Attractive dark green foliage which is highly disease resistant.

An easy to look after variety which will produce the best results in full sun.

Named after Nurse Tracey Davies who died aged 40 after a long battle with cancer.

Floribunda. 1988. 2ft-3ft.

An attractive rose with clusters of orange blend blooms which are quite a striking colour.

Flowers in flushes throughout the summer and into autumn and the first frosts.

Produces plenty of blooms so the spent blooms should be removed regularly to promote repeat flowering and to keep the plant tidy.

Nice healthy foliage and good disease resistance.

The stems are not very long being a floribunda, but it does make an attractive cut flower.

Fruity fragrance.

Not very well known at the moment, but that should all change soon with the next Olympic Games coming to London in 2012.

PRINCE JARDINIER (Meitroni)

Hybrid Tea Rose. 2006. 2ft-3ft

.A stunning hybrid tea rose with beautiful large blooms of light pink. Healthy glossy dark green foliage set the classic blooms of to perfection. This beauty has won many awards around the world including the Gold Standard Award.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA OF KENT (Ausmerchant)

English Shrub Rose. David Austin. 2007. 3-4ft

A very beautiful rose with unusually large flowers of a warm, glowing pink. They are full-petalled and deeply cupped in shape, all enclosed in a ring of outer petals of a softer pink, creating a most pleasing effect.

In spite of their size, they are never clumsy, being held nicely poised on a well rounded shrub. Because of their size, there is a lot to be said for planting in groups of three, keeping both flowers and growth nicely balanced.

They have a delicious fresh Tea fragrance which, interestingly changes completely to lemon as the flower ages - eventually taking on additional hints of blackcurrants.

Very healthy and hardy with good repeat flowering cycle.

Princess Alexandra is a cousin to Queen Elizabeth 11, and a keen gardener and lover of roses.



QUEEN ANNE (Austruck)

English Shrub Rose. David Austin.

'Queen Anne' is another rose of classic Old Rose beauty, but more in the direction of the Centifolias or Bourbons.

The medium sized flowers are a very pure rose pink, the outer petals only slightly paler than the central ones.

In habit 'Queen Anne' is quite upright but still bushy and has very few thorns.

It could be used very affectively in beds where more formal roses are required, or it would look equally at home in more informal surroundings, whether planted with other roses or mixed in with perennials.

The flowers have a good fragrance with hints of pear drops at first, changing to a most attractive, rounded Old Rose scent.

The 'Queen Anne' rose was named to celebrate the tercentenary of Ascot Racecourse. The world's most famous racecourse was founded by Queen Anne in 1711.

RASPBERRY ROYALE

Patio Rose. 2004. 1ft-2ft.

An attractive little patio rose with masses of raspberry red blooms all summer long.

A cheerful little rose which will brighten up any garden or patio.

Quite happy in the garden or container.

Healthy glossy dark green foliage with excellent disease resistance.

Light fragrance but very pleasant.

For best results place in a sunny position and dead head regularly.

SANDRA

Not a strong perfume, but quite pleasant.

SCENTED CARPET (Chewground)

Ground Cover Rose. 2004. 2ftx4ft

A very attractive Ground Cover rose with masses of lilac pink blooms with a white centre and pronounced golden anthers.

The blooms are produced in flushes throughout the summer until the first frosts.

Small glossy olive green foliage which is extremely clean and healthy.

Introduced by Chris Warner who has bred many award winning roses.

Has a very good perfume which is unusual in ground cover roses.

Also known in the USA as 'Oso Easy Fragrant Spreader'



SILVER GHOST (Kormirari)

Shrub Rose. 2001. 2ft

A very beautiful shrub with an abundance of pure white flowers with attractive golden stamens in the centre.

Good flower production, and flowers from early summer to autumn.

A very robust little shrub which is quite happy in the garden or a large container.

A very healthy rose with glossy dark green foliage which sets the blooms off perfectly.

Excellent disease resistance and easy to maintain.

One of the few repeat flowering ramblers around.
The stems are relatively thornless and straight but are still easy to train over an arch, across a wall, fence or trellis.
Needs support to reach 10ft, or can be grown as a large shrub without support.

English Shrub Rose. David Austin. 2004. 5ft

The flowers of 'The Ingenious Mr. Fairchild' are in the form of deep cups filled with crisp, upstanding petals. The colour on the inside of the petals is a deep pink touched with lilac; the outside is of a paler shade.

Looking at the bloom in more detail, one can see that the edges are an even deeper pink; giving a most delightful fringed effect - particularly in the earlier stages.

The growth is ideal with spreading, arching branches building up into a well-rounded, mounding shrub; with its flowers nicely poised.

It is very healthy. It has a strong and deliciously fruity rose fragrance, with aspects of raspberry, peach and a hint of mint.

All in all, a very beautiful rose and one of our favourites.



Named after Thomas Fairchild, a nurseryman of London and Fellow of the Royal Society, who made the first recorded flower hybrid in Europe in 1720.

This was a cross between a Sweet William and a carnation, which became known as 'Fairchild's mule'. With thanks to Michael Leapman for the name, which was the title of his excellent biography on Thomas Fairchild.

THE LADY'S BLUSH (Ausocar)

English Shrub Rose. David Austin. 2010. 4ft.

A charming semi-double variety. The flowers start as elegant pointed buds and develop into rounded cups. Their colour is a pure soft pink with a creamy-white eye at the centre and often a white stripe. As with all semi-double roses, the central group of stamens is a very important feature. These are particularly fine; a beautiful soft yellow colour with highlights of golden-yellow pollen. At the point of attachment to the stamens there is a prominent red ring which accentuates the effect.

The overall impression is of freshness and grace. This is a healthy variety, perfect for all types of borders. Especially effective when grown with annuals or perennials in a mixed border. A rose of dainty, natural beauty. It will grow into an attractive rounded bushy plant

WOLLERTON OLD HALL (Ausblanket)

English Shrub Rose. David Austin. 2011. 5ft.

This is the most fragrant of this year's new varieties and, indeed, one of the most fragrant of all English Roses. It has the distinctive myrrh scent which is rarely found in roses, appearing first in 'Constance Spry', and later in 'Scepter'd Isle'. The plump buds have attractive flashes of red. These open to form round, rich buttery yellow coloured blooms which eventually pale to a softer creamy colour. Even when the flowers are fully open, they retain their beautifully rounded chalice shape. It forms a particularly healthy and bushy shrub with many stems shooting from the base. It remains relatively upright and has few thorns. With its soft colouring 'Wollerton Old Hall' will very easily blend with a wide range of colour schemes, planted with roses or other shrubs and perennials. Its more upright habit makes it suitable for both formal and informal situations. It should be positioned where its strong scent can be easily appreciated.

Wollerton Old Hall in Shropshire has one of the most beautiful private gardens in the country, not far from Country Garden Roses.

The gardens are set around a 16th Century Hall and feature roses in creative plant combinations, including many English Roses. Wollerton Old Hall is open to the public on selected days throughout the summer.
